FESTIVITIES IN JMV

1. National Constitution Day (26 Nov 2025): To commemorate the National Constitution Day on 26 Nov 2025, a special morning assembly was conducted with great enthusiasm and patriotic fervor. The program aimed to instil constitutional values and deepen students' understanding of their civic responsibilities. The highlight of the assembly was a student-led podcast that explored the significance of the Indian Constitution. As a mark of respect and commitment to the nation, students solemnly presented the Fundamental Duties enshrined in the Constitution. TEACHERS

1. The training offered a broad spectrum of modern support techniques and current methodologies for assisting students with SLDs, covering everything from basic identification and screening to TEP execution and the effective utilization of modern AI tools. Each day was dedicated to a specific theme related to the overall topic and involved the sharing of deep insights and practical strategies. Overall, the programme proved to be a comprehensive and enriching learning experience for all participants. 9. 13. 8.
