FESTIVITIES IN JMV

1.National Sports Day (29 August 2025): National Sports Day was celebrated in the Vidyalaya on 29 August 2025 with great enthusiasm. The day served as a tribute to the legendary "Hockey Wizard" Major Dhyan Chand, whose birth anniversary is commemorated annually as National Sports Day. To mark the occasion, a special assembly was held, featuring a Factopedia Session in which Dishant Khatri (X J) and Shreya Sethi (XII M) shared fascinating sports facts. Palak Garg (XII S) delivered an inspiring speech on the life of Major Dhyan Chand, highlighting his journey as a true champion and encouraging students to embrace the values of dedication, discipline, and sportsmanship. To add an element of fun to learning, a series of exercises and recreational activities were organised for students from Classes III to XII. These activities promoted fitness, joy, and overall well-being, making the celebration both informative and physically engaging.

2.Kshamapna Diwas (28 August 2025): Kshamapna Diwas, the festival of forgiveness, was celebrated in the Vidyalaya with great fervour and devotion on 28 August 2025. During the special assembly students acquainted all with India's inspiring voyage through space exploration. An inter house painting competition was organised for the students of classes IX to XII where students expressed their thoughts and expressions in creative ways. An online quiz link was also shared in IX to XII class groups. Informative and exciting videos were also shown to students.

6.Independence Day Celebration & Janmashtami (14 August 2025): Vidyalaya celebrated the 79th Independence Day of the nation and the festival of Janmashtami with immense zeal and fervour on 14th August 2025. The celebration was a vibrant tribute to the spirit of patriotism and cultural heritage. A special program comprised a stirring patriotic speech reflecting deep love for the motherland and a poem, a mesmerizing dance performance, celebrating the birth of Lord Krishna, added to the joy of festivities. A heartfelt poem on cleanliness, beautifully composed by Vidyalaya faculty Mr. Manoj Kumar was also presented. Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj administered a Swachhta pledge to all, emphasizing the importance of cleanliness and civic responsibility as integral to nation-building. Highlight of the programme was a vibrant dance performance by Vidyalaya faculty members to some foot tapping patriotic songs, filling the atmosphere with enthusiasm. On this occasion, the *Sanskrit Samvadshala* was formally inaugurated by the Principal, Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj, in Optional Room-II on the second floor. REINVENTING OURSELVES

TEACHERS

1.The workshop "*Skills to Careers*", organised by CBSE in collaboration with IBM, was held on 29th August 2025. The session was graced by esteemed dignitaries including the Chairperson of CBSE, the Project Director of Atal Innovation Mission, and a representative from IBM. The workshop commenced with an introduction to the integration of skill-based subjects in classrooms. Ms. Deepali, Project Director, officially launched the ATL Cookbook, emphasizing its significance in fostering innovation among students. Several practical ideas were shared during the session, aimed at making classroom learning more engaging and skill-oriented. The workshop proved to be highly informative and inspiring, offering fresh perspectives on skill education and the integration of AI in teaching practices. The event was attended by Mr. Janmejy, ATL Mentor.

2.A virtual meeting was organised by School Cinema on 23 August 2025 under the theme "Ask Me Anything". Two Vidyalaya faculty members, Ms. Geetika Trivedi (TGT English) and Ms. Shefali Kataria (PRT English), attended the meeting, which was conducted by Miss Debjani, Head of Training and School Relationship. The discussion focused on classroom experiences of implementing the program, IT related queries, workbook and activity clarification as well as suggestions and feedback. The impact of the program on students and teachers was also highlighted. The session proved to be insightful, providing a platform to share best practices and enhance the effective use of school cinema in classrooms.

3.On August 23, 2025, a virtual session on PFOG was organized by Shri Atma Vallabh Jain Federation of Educational Institutions. The programme commenced with the chanting of the Namokar Mahamantra, creating a serene and spiritual atmosphere. Vidyalaya Principal, Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj extended a warm welcome to the dignitaries—Sh. D.K. Jain Ji- President of the Federation, Sh. S.K. Jain Ji- Retired IPS, DGP Meghalya, Dr. Abha Bansal, Dr. Cheshtha, Dr. Pankaj, Ms. Ruchika, Ms. Mamta and all Educators from member institutions. Dr. Pankaj conducted the session as she gave a detailed presentation on the theme PFOG—Personal Mastery, Forgiveness, Others' Well-being, and Gratitude. She elaborated on the concept of the Golden Circle, which emphasizes clarity of Why, discipline of How, and consistency of What. The Federation's mission of promoting value-based education for holistic development was highlighted. The session included thought-provoking stories with deep moral lessons on mindfulness, and positivity. Sh. S.K. Jain Ji shared his insights on embracing challenges, advising that one should never run away from difficulties, rather accept them, learn from them, and see every challenge as an opportunity. He also guided that it is important to practice self-love. Dr. Pankaj concluded the session with the message of letting go of unnecessary worries, giving one's hundred percent without being overly concerned about the results, and expressing gratitude towards Lord Mahavir. In her concluding remarks, the Vidyalaya Principal emphasized the importance of personal mastery. She urged teachers to reflect on the seven habits of highly effective people, beginning with private victory before moving on to public victory. The session ended on a highly motivating note, leaving all participants inspired with renewed positivity, gratitude, and commitment to holistic education and self-mastery.

4. A physical training session for nodal teachers on the National Deworming Programme was organized at SKV, AH Block, Shalimar Bagh, Delhi on 22 August 2025. During the session, participants were briefed on the necessary steps to be followed while administering Albendazole tablets to students. The session was attended by Ms. Suman Yadav (PGT Physical Education).

5. An Orientation Program was conducted on the MOOC (Massive Open Online Course) program of the SWAYAM Portal initiated by CBSE on 20 August 2025 for Delhi West Region in 2 sessions, in online mode. Resource Person, Dr. Heman Mehlawat, focussed on familiarising teachers (students and parents) with the features, objectives and benefits of the digital platform. The session was attended by Ms. Preeti Chawla (PGT Commerce) and Ms. Geetika Trivedi (TGT English).

6. A session on class management for teachers of classes VI to VIII was conducted by Vidyalaya Principal on 12 August 2025. The focus was on equipping teachers with effective strategies to manage students in this energetic age group. To effectively channelize the students of this age group, the teacher must be SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time Bound) with a compassionate heart. Key strategies discussed for effective class room management were: -

(i) Mandatory head count

(ii) Streamline students' movement with the help of class monitor and prefect yet remain vigilant.

(iii) Tailored lesson plans to cater to diverse learning styles.

(iv) Incorporate fun and engaging activities in the class.

7. The Awakened Ambassadors for Community Transformation online training for teachers, a Mentor Programme and a cornerstone initiative of the Rama Krishna Mission's commitment to holistic education, was conducted on 11 August 2025. It is designed to amplify the impact of the Awakened Citizen Programme by fostering a robust ecosystem of mentorship for participating educators. The three-hour online training provided a comprehensive introduction to the programme, emphasizing its core principles and practical implementation. The training session was attended by five teachers of the Vidyalaya: Ms. Sarika Verma (TGT English), Ms. Urmila Rana (TGT Science), Mr. Manoj Vashisth (TGT Hindi), Ms. Kavita Mann (TGT Hindi), and Ms. Pallavi Dhir (PRT Science). Overall, the training offered a clear vision of 'Becoming Ambassadors of Change.'

8. A session on effective classroom management was conducted by the Principal of the Vidyalaya, Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj on 11 August 2025 for the teachers of classes III- V. The session began with a discussion on the importance of maintaining proper discipline and ensuring student safety. It was stressed that the head count must be taken in the beginning of every period, without fail, as this is a vital practice for accountability and the well-being of students. The discussion then moved to effective lesson planning, with "Knowing your learners" highlighted as the most essential step. Teachers were encouraged to understand each student's needs, strengths and learning styles to make lessons engaging and impactful. Attention was also given to learning outcomes as a means to determine whether students have understood the concepts. Identifying learning gaps was considered a priority, and it was suggested that syndicates (small peer learning groups) be formed to help bridge these gaps. This approach would encourage teamwork, mutual support and a culture of love and unity among students rather than

creating divisions. In matters of discipline during movement, prefects and monitors should be positioned in between the lines for better supervision, and teachers should maintain overall discipline while taking the children for any activity to ensure order and safety. Finally, Vidyalaya Principal discussed the difference between negligence and accident, ensuring clarity among staff in understanding and addressing such situations appropriately.

9. Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj attended School Leader's Summit 2025 on 8 August 2025 at Holiday Inn Aerocity, Delhi. The summit included insightful talks by Sh. Amogh Lila Das ji and celebrity couple Ms. Rohit Chaudhary & Ms. Manisha Singh. There were panel discussions on the themes Building Pathways: Strengthening School-University Synergy and Compassionate Leadership for Global Citizenship. The learned Congregation also had an engaging session with Mr. Jitin Chawla.

10. An online orientation and training programme, organized by CIET, NCERT, was held on 6 August 2025, marking the Day 3 of the programme. Six states participated in the training programme. The one-hour session was attended by Mr. Yogesh Kumar (Sr. Incharge) and Mr. Vijay Rajeshwari (Special Educator). The guest and trainee speakers were Dr. Anchal Rani, Academic Consultant at CIET, NCERT and Mr. Ranjeet Kumar, QA Manager at Trigyn. The training focussed on the new version of the PRASHAST Mobile application. The participants including teachers, Headmasters and Special Educators were trained about the new Login process and technical issues. The trainers also provided training to the Special educators on the updated features of the PRASHAST app. All the Special Educators were asked to train the teachers of their respective school about the latest updates of PRASHAST App.

11. The Atal Innovation Mission organized an informative online workshop on 8 August 2025 to guide participants on how to celebrate 'The Mega Tinkering Day' on 12 August in every ATL. During the workshop, the AIM team explained the significance of Mega Tinkering Day in promoting creativity, hands-on learning, and innovation among students. They provided a detailed pre-event plan, which included steps for preparing resources, inviting student participation, setting up the ATL workspace, and arranging the necessary materials for the live activity. It was announced that during the event, students from all participating schools would collaboratively build a vacuum cleaner, live within one hour, as part of the celebration. This activity aimed to enhance and engage students in practical problem-solving, teamwork, and the application of STEM skills. The workshop was attended by Mr. Janmejy Kumar, ATL Mentor.

12. Creating Safe Spaces, Understanding and implementing the POCSO Act in schools was the theme of capacity-building session which was organised by Legal Swan Team on 1 August 2025, covering legal responsibilities under the POCSO Act, early warning signs of child abuse, how to respond to a child's disclosure and the role of schools in mandatory reporting & child protection. The session was a wonderful learning experience as it included a lot of insights in the form of personal sharings, case studies, real examples and latest legal verdicts by the different courts in different parts of India. It was attended by Ms Somdatta Bhattacharya (Vice Principal), Mr. Yogesh Kumar (Sr. Incharge), Ms. Himanshu Manchanda (Pr. Incharge), Ms. Sangeeta Nain (PGT Psychology), Ms. Lokesh Sharma (Primary Teacher).

13. Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj attended the RP Meet organised by CBSE Centre of Excellence on 28 July 2025. The meet was held at The Indian Heights school, Sector 23, Dwarka, Delhi. Dr. Manoj Srivastava, Director Training, Sh. Srinivasan (RO) Delhi West Joint Secretary, Ms. Ramandeep and Ms. Usha Negi, Head COE graced the RP Meet with their presence.

STUDENTS

1. A week-long Self Defence Training Programme was successfully organised in the Vidyalaya from 1 August 2025 to 8 August for the girl students of classes VI-XII. It was a collaborative effort with the Parivartan Cell of the Delhi Police. The resource team comprised Head Constable Ms. Arti and Head Constable Ms. Samista both of whom are highly trained and experienced. They were later joined by Ms Jasrini who brought in additional expertise. The programme began on 1 August with a green welcome of the team and introduction of the objective of the training. The sessions were meticulously planned to combine physical drills, practical demonstrations and awareness talks. Students were introduced to a variety of self-defence moves. On the last day, Ms. Jasrini highlighted the ill-effects of social media, the dangers of sharing personal information and methods to safeguard from online frauds. She also shared helpline numbers along with information about support systems available for women in distress. Vice Principal, Ms. Somdatta Bhattacharyya highlighted the role of such programmes in fostering self-confidence among young women. Vote of thanks was proposed by Head Girl, Kriti. Overall, the Self-Defence Training not only equipped the girl students with practical combat skills but also instilled in them a sense of self-worth, courage and readiness to face real- life challenges.

2. A session on CUET was conducted on 07 August 2025 by the Vidyalaya for the students of class XII (All Streams). The aim was to familiarize the students with the CUET Examination pattern and universities specific Admission Protocol. It provided insight to the students in subject based selection. The session was attended by 150 students. Students gained valuable knowledge as they were guided about the steps to Log in to their Dashboards for FREE CUET TEST SERIES introduced by the Vidyalaya. Students participated enthusiastically and the session enlightened all.

3. On 2 August 2025, the G.K. Club organised a seminar aimed at boosting the general knowledge and awareness of its members. The session witnessed the enthusiastic participation of 45 students from classes VI to XII. It was skilfully led by Mr. Deepak Kashyap, an experienced Quiz Master, who introduced students to various techniques such as smart guessing, lateral thinking and clue interpretation. The session included warm-up trivia, interactive discussions, and mini quiz activities, all centred around sports, providing students with both knowledge and practical quizzing experience.

4. As part of Bharatiya Bhasha Summer Camp, a 7-day program (22 July 2025 to 1 August 2025) was organised by SCERT for classes III to V to foster multi-lingualism by celebrating the linguistic diversity of India. Our school opted for Punjabi as the focus language. A total of 312 students and 7 teachers participated. The program included basic greetings, expressions, alphabets, numbers and real-life conversation practice. Students explored Punjabi music, dance, local cuisine and culture. Sessions also highlighted freedom fighters, historical and geographical knowledge of Punjab, and motivational talks. The program concluded with reflections, fostering appreciation for linguistic diversity and national integration.

1. A PTM was organised by the Vidyalaya on 30 August 2025 for the parents of students of classes Nursery to XII. It facilitated communication and collaboration between teachers and parents.
2. The CBSE Hub and School Counselling Counsellors Meeting was held on 30th August 2025. The session commenced with a green welcome extended by the Vidyalaya Principal, Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj (Hub School), to counsellor teachers from various spoke schools. She then briefed the gathering on the purpose of the Hub-and-Spoke model and the collaborative role of all participating schools. Following this, Ms. Sangeeta Nain, Coordinator (Hub School), presented key CBSE guidelines through a PowerPoint presentation. The session proved to be enlightening, offering valuable insights into effective counselling practices. A total of nine counsellor teachers from five spoke schools attended the meeting.
3. On 23rd August 2025, JMV conducted a series of CBSE Hub and School Calendar activities aimed at strengthening psycho-social support within the Vidyalaya ecosystem for stakeholders including students of Classes IX to XII, parents, teachers, and support staff. Teachers participated in a self-journaling workshop that introduced reflective writing as a tool for emotional awareness and personal growth. Parents attended an online session focused on socio-emotional wellness in adolescents, offering insights into nurturing mental health and communication during teenage years. Meanwhile, support staff were oriented on the provisions of the POCSO Act, 2012, enhancing their understanding of child protection laws and their role in maintaining a safe school environment. These initiatives collectively fostered a more empathetic, informed, and resilient school community.
4. An interactive session on “Nurturing Adolescents’ Socio-Emotional Needs” was organised by the Vidyalaya on 23 August 2025 for the students and parents of Classes IX - XII. The session commenced with a warm address by the Principal, who welcomed the attendees and spoke about the importance of nurturing children with care and sensitivity. She remarked that “values are caught, not taught” and stressed that the Vidyalaya alone cannot implement the recent changes guided by CBSE and sought cooperation and collaboration of parents for the same. She urged parents to strengthen their bond with their children, spend quality time with them, provide emotional support, and guide them with patience and understanding. In her presentation, School Counsellor, Ms. Sangeeta, highlighted that adolescence is often a stressful phase — a “roller coaster” of emotions — where children struggle with peer pressure and academic stress. She shared insights from her interactions with adolescents, underlining the importance of addressing their socio-emotional needs. She guided parents on how they can support their children by being active listeners, ensuring a balanced lifestyle, encouraging right company, practicing mindfulness and above all, giving unconditional love. The programme proved highly enriching, equipping both students and parents with valuable strategies to support adolescents during this crucial phase of life.
5. Jain Bharati Mrigavati Vidyalaya always works towards academic excellence. Keeping this aim in mind, Vidyalaya is providing platform of CUET-Test series for the students of class XII, to practice the selective Response Questions (SRQ) which will help them to prepare not only for their CBSE Exams but also for the common Entrance Test (CUET). To acquaint the students and parents

regarding the same, an online interactive session, with Vidyalaya Principal was organised on 06 August 2025. The Vidyalaya Principal put emphasis on the significance of this Test series and the process of students' Log in. All the teachers teaching class XII and a total 131 students and parents attended the session.

Students from our Vidyalaya, spanning Classes VI to XII, participated enthusiastically in the first round of this prestigious event. The preliminary round assessed students' logical reasoning, problem-solving, and analytical skills. A total of 21 students from the Vidyalaya qualified for the second round, where they were required to submit innovative solutions to real-world problems. The qualified students were grouped into teams of three, forming seven teams in total. Each team submitted a unique and creative idea for evaluation in the second round.

2. MANASVITA-The Inter School Wellness Quiz 2025 was held on 23 August 2025 at Modern Public School, Shalimar Bagh.
