CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS FROM 1 June 2025 To 22 July 2025

FESTIVITIES IN JMV

1. Guru Purnima (10 July 2025): On July 10, 2025, Vidyalaya held a special assembly to celebrate Guru Purnima, in which students expressed their heartfelt gratitude to their Gurus through a variety of performances. Students of Class VIII recited a meaningful couplet dedicated to all their teachers, while the students of Class VII J presented a touching play titled "*Gurudevo Bhava*" in honour of their mentors. The ceremony concluded with the Vidyalaya Principal offering blessings and extending warm wishes for a Happy Guru Purnima to everyone.

2. Punyatithi of Mahattara Sadhvi Mrigavati Shri Ji Maharaj Saheb (7 July 2025): On July 7, 2025, the school held a special assembly in solemn remembrance of Mahattara Sadhvi Mrigavati Shri Ji Maharaj Saheb on her Punyatithi. During the event, Mr. Sunil Kumar (TGT, Sanskrit) acquainted the students with the inspiring life and teachings of Maharaj Saheb. Vidyalaya Principal, Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj, encouraged the students to embrace the practice of 'Swadhyay' as exemplified by Maharaj Saheb. Following the assembly, all the students visited Maharaj Saheb's Samadhi, offering their respects and receiving her blessings.

3. World Zoonoses Day (6th July): To commemorate World Zoonoses Day, Vidyalaya organised a special assembly on 11th July 2025 aimed at fostering awareness about Zoonotic diseases - transmitted from animals to humans. The program commenced with an informative talk about common zoonotic diseases such as rabies, swine flu and COVID-19, emphasizing the importance of hygiene, vaccination and responsible interaction with animals. Students also talked about first aid for dog bite and emphasised the importance of timely and complete vaccination.

4. International Day of Yoga (21 June 2025): To mark the Eleventh International Day of Yoga, students, parents and teachers of Vidyalaya actively participated in a virtual Yoga session on 21 June 25. The session included a practice of an array of asanas and pranayama that benefit both physical and mental well - being. Videos on the Common Yoga Protocol and Yoga Quiz hosted on the MyGov App were shared through the WhatsApp and broadcast groups.

5. Reading Day (19 June 2025): The 30th Reading Day was celebrated on 19th June 2025 with great enthusiasm and literary spirit at JMV through a well-curated online event, bringing together, students, teachers and parents virtually to promote the joy of reading. The program began with the soulful chanting of Namokar Mahamantra, creating a calm and positive atmosphere. Vidyalaya Principal officially inaugurated the celebration with an inspiring message on the importance of reading, highlighting how it nurtures imagination, knowledge and empathy. Students participated actively through short video clips sharing about their favourite book and reading experiences. A special highlight was the creative 'Bend the End' by Vidyalaya's shining stars. A video presentation on the benefits of reading and vocabulary enrichment emphasized how regular reading enhances comprehension and academic performance. The segment "Fostering Love for Reading in JMV" showcased various school initiatives encouraging reading habits. The event also featured poem recitation and insightful book reviews, adding literary charm. The event concluded with the Reading Pledge, where students reaffirmed their commitment to regular reading and spreading the joy of books. The celebration was a wonderful reminder of the power of books to enlighten and empower young minds.

REINVENTING OURSELVES

TEACHERS

1. JMV hosted District Level Deliberations Workshop on STEM Education on 22 July 2025. A contingent of 13 schools including the host school participated in the event. The workshop began with the recitation of Namokar Mahamantra followed by the lighting of the ceremonial lamp. A green welcome of planters and paintings made by Vidyalaya students was extended to the revered guests, Dr. Geetika Kalra Professor, Department of Botany, Acharya Narendra Dev College (DU), Ms Geeta Kumar (PGT Physics) Mahavir Senior Model School, Delhi and Ms. Shikha Thakur (HOD Comp. Science), Bal Bharati Public School by Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj. A total of 43 educators participated in the workshop and had engaging discussions on STEM. 12 presentations sharing ideas to promote Teaching & Learning of Science using STEM were delivered and case-studies were presented. The Appreciation Committee comprising the three distinguished luminaries - Dr. Geetika Kalra, Ms. Geeta Kumar & Ms. Shikha Thakur shared their insights and valuable feedback on the presentations. Dr. Geetika Kalra apprised the gathering of the need of nurturing innovation and scientific aptitude. Vidyalaya Principal thanked the galaxy of educators for their valuable insights.

2. Vidyalaya Principal attended a 'Principals Meet and Greet' session organised by Avvya Edify at the Museum of Illusions, New Delhi on 19th July 2025. The session aimed to celebrate educators and promote engaging discussion on developing stress free AI powered learning methods for students.

3. The Ayushman Bhav Samvad Dialogue Webinar was organized by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) on July 19, 2025 in online mode. The initiative aimed to promote discussions on food safety, public health and the importance of Ayurveda Aahaar. Experts highlighted the role of safe and natural foods in disease prevention and overall wellness. The event encouraged public awareness and collaboration towards building a healthier and sustainable future. It was attended by Ms. Moumita Chatterjee (TGT Science).

4. Senior Incharge, Mr. Yogesh Kumar attended Celebration of Birth Anniversary of Mr. Nelson Mandela on 18 July 2025 at Gandhi Smriti, 5 Tees January Marg. The programme was presided over by Chief Guest Prof. Anil Sooklal, High Commissioner of South Africa to India, Mr Virendra Gupta, Former Ambassador of India to South Africa and Sh. Vijay Goel, Vice Chairman of Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti & Former Union Minister. In his address, Sh. Anil Sooklal highlighted, the legacy of Mahatma Gandhi and Sh. Nelson Mandela and their relevance in the modern context.

5. A Hub & Spoke meeting was organised in online mode through Zoom on 11 July 2025. The agenda of the meeting was to help the spoke schools understand the activity calendar for the month of July 2025. It was discussed that all schools need to conduct parenting sessions in their schools & the respective counsellor of each school need to do the same. Further they were requested to submit the report of these sessions in soft copy till 25th July 2025. Schools were also requested to submit their forms for DLD program to be held on 22 July. Ms Poornima, Principal of Sant Sujan Singh Ji International School & Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj Principal of the Lead School, Jain Bharati Mrigavati Vidyalaya, attended the virtual meeting.

6. On 8 July 2025, an interactive session on Strengthening Assessment and Evaluation was conducted by the Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj for the teachers teaching classes VI-X. The session aimed to deepen educators' understanding of the key differences between assessment and evaluation, explore various types of assessments and emphasize their role in enhancing the learning process. A detailed discussion was held on the concept of multiple assessments, emphasizing how diverse assessment methods address the varied learning needs and abilities of students. Additionally, the importance of maintaining student portfolios was underscored, highlighting its value in facilitating Academic and Co-Scholastic Development. The session proved to be highly informative, offering valuable insights and practical strategies to enhance teaching effectiveness and assessment practices.

7. District level Deliberation (DLD) was organised by Mount Abu Public School on 5 July 2025. The purpose of the event was to share the experiences regarding inclusion of STEM by different schools. It was a Capacity Building Program for Educators by the Educators. Ms Pratibha Kohli, Principal of Maharaja Agarsen Public School, Ms Vineeta Garg (HOD Computer Science of DAV School) and Mr Pankaj Kumar (HOD of Computer Science, Army Public School) comprised the appreciation committee and shared their views regarding inclusion of technology and how to promote curiosity, innovation and research among young learners. There were papers presented by 14 teachers from different schools on four sub themes. Mr Manoj Kumar Srivastava addressed the gathering and emphasised on providing data driven outcome in the research paper. The event was attended by Ms. Sonu Jain (TGT Science).

8. Online Parenting Calendar Orientation Sessions were organized by CBSE from 3rd June 2025 to 5th June 2025. The webinar aimed to encourage schools to incorporate the suggested activities into their academic plans and to engage parents in a meaningful way. The sessions also focused on equipping schools with insights, strategies, and best practices for effectively implementing the calendar activities within their school ecosystem. The sessions were attended by Ms. Sangeeta Nain (PGT Psychology).

STUDENTS

1. On July 9, 2025, the G.K. Club of Vidyalaya organised a seminar aimed at boosting the general knowledge and awareness of its members. The event was held in the conference hall near the Vidyalaya and saw the active participation of 50 students from classes VI - XII. Mr. Arindam Bhattacharya, a renowned quiz-master spoke passionately about the importance of general awareness and the development of quizzing abilities for performing well in quiz competitions. Overall, the seminar was a great success. It served as a valuable platform for expanding students' knowledge and inspiring them to stay inquisitive and informed. An online session was also organized in the same context on 11 July 2025. Mr. Deepak Kashyap was the keynote speaker.

RENDEVOUZ

1. Vidyalaya Principal conducted a meeting with the student members of the Prefectorial Board on 14 July 2025. She discussed at length a few questions which the Prefectorial board students were asked to ponder upon and pen down in their notebooks. She interacted with the student members and asked them to express their views regarding the same as she urged them to be responsible and to find answers to the "Why" factor i.e. why they have been assigned the important role and how they can do their best while delivering their pivotal duties. 54 student members out of 56 attended the meeting as the 2 students were absent.

2. On 4 July 2025, the Vidyalaya Principal convened a meeting with the teacher-members of the Prefectorial Board. Three key points were emphasized during the meeting:

1. What is the purpose of constituting the Prefectorial Board?
2. Why have I been selected for a particular post?
3. What are my roles and responsibilities?

The Principal then requested that the teacher-members to hold a follow-up meeting with the student prefects on 5 July 2025. In the meeting, students were asked to reflect on the three questions asked previously and to present their responses in writing by 7 July 2025. Students were reminded to respect the deadline and submit their answers on time.

3. Vidyalaya Principal held an interactive session with the parents of students from classes Nursery - XII on 30 June 2025 which was conducted online. She warmly welcomed all the attendees who had joined online and expressed her exuberation for the students returning to school. She encouraged them to energetically come to school with hopes and aspirations as enthusiastic learners. Quoting a Sanskrit shloka, she outlined the qualities of an ideal student and stressed the importance of being attentive learners. She also urged the parents to encourage their wards to actively listen to the instructions of the teachers. Highlighting the value of Swadhyay (self-study), she further explained that effective learning depends on four essential components: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. She also informed parents about the skill modules introduced by CBSE for the students of classes VI -XII. She elaborated upon age-appropriate skill sets recommended for students from classes Nursery-VIII. The parents were further informed that a dedicated Swadhyay room has been established for primary students to engage in self-study. Vidyalaya Principal highlighted the significance of acquiring 21st century global skills necessary for succeeding in future educational pursuits. She elaborated upon the integration of the head, heart and hand, underscoring the need to regard the dignity of labour. In conclusion, she encouraged students to prepare for their return to school with enthusiasm and alacrity. The aim of the program was to build curiosity about psychology, foster resilience and encourage sensitive conversations around mental health. It was a learning experience for the students.
