#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

1.Result of classes X and XII was declared by CBSE on 13 May 2024. It was a stupendous achievement by the students of both the classes as they achieved 100% result. **Supriya Batra, Parth Khatri and Shaivi Chauhan emerged as class X toppers with impressive scores of 96%, 95.6% and 95.6% respectively. In Class XII, Jahanavi topped the Humanities Stream with 96%, Atishay Jain led the Commerce stream with 95.2% and Vishesh Chauhan secured the top position in the Science stream with 88.6%.** This exceptional outcome stands as a testament to the unwavering dedication and hard work of all key stakeholders.

#### FESTIVITIES IN JMV

**1.International Day for Biological Diversity (22 May 2025):** Vidyalaya conducted a special assembly on 22 May 2025 to mark the International Day for Biological Diversity. A talk on biodiversity and shlokas presented by the students resonated with this year's theme 'Harmony with Nature and Sustainable Development'.

**2.Orientation Program (17 May 2025):** The Orientation Programme for the parents of new admissions of classes Nur -II, was held with zeal and positivity in Jr. wing on 17 May 2025. The event began with the chanting of Namokar Mahamantra followed by sharing of a brief history of the Vidyalaya. ## **REINVENTING OURSELVES**

### **TEACHERS**

1. A three-days Teachers Empowerment Programme, 'Sankalp,' organised by Jain Federation of Educational Institutions was held from 29th to 31st May 2025 in the tranquil premises of Vallabh Smarak Jain Mandir Tirth. The programme which commenced with the articulation of individual Statements of Purpose was graced by the presence of luminaries such as Sh. D.K. Jain, President of Shree Atma Vallabh Jain Federation of Educational Institutions, Sh. Vipin Jain Co-Chairman of Vidyalaya ,Sh. Ashok Jain, Honorary Secretary of Shree Atma Vallabh Jain Federation of Educational Institutions, , Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj, Vidyalaya Principal and other distinguished guests. It brought together 77 educators from 10 schools including 40 teachers of Vidyalaya in a shared pursuit of purpose-driven and values-based teaching. This profound beginning established the reflective tone of the programme, which culminated in a feedback and learning circle—an open forum where each educator candidly shared their key take aways, personal evolutions, and envisioned shifts in mindset and practice. Each day began with the sacred resonance of the Namokar Mahamantra and bhajans, followed by Affirmations and gratitude journaling further anchoring participants in positivity and self-belief . **Day 1** laid the groundwork for self-inquiry and professional rejuvenation. The highlight of the day was the insightful presentation on PFOG (Personal Mastery, Forgiveness, Others' Wellbeing, Gratitude) by Vidyalaya Sr. Incharge - Mr. Yogesh and Primary Inch. Ms. Himanshu Manchanda. Each school presented heartfelt narratives and creative expressions, exemplifying introspection and ingenuity. **Day 3** elevated the learning through a compelling Swadhyay session conducted by the revered Dr. Jitendra B. Shah, who shed light on the intersection of Jain philosophy and modern educational ethics. In conclusion, all the participants submitted action plans—symbolizing a formal pledge towards sustained growth. The programme gracefully concluded with a group photograph and a shared meal, encapsulating the spirit of unity and celebration. Participants left inspired, anchored in purpose, and invigorated to infuse their classrooms with empathy, excellence, and ethical intent.

2. On May 30, 2025, JMV organized a training session titled “AI Tools in Teaching,” attended by 55 teachers of Vidyalaya. The goal of the session was to enhance teachers' digital proficiency and promote the effective use of artificial intelligence in classroom instruction. The training covered essential topics, including an introduction to AI, the use of tools like ChatGPT, Canva AI and Magic School AI for lesson planning, content creation, and assessment as well as the ethical considerations of using AI in education. The session featured live demonstrations and hands-on activities, making it practical and engaging. This workshop not only expanded participants' knowledge of AI applications in education but also empowered them with innovative strategies to make teaching more efficient, personalized, and interactive.

3. A Financial Literacy Workshop was conducted at the Atal Tinkering Lab on 30th May 2025 for the teaching faculty. The session was led by two certified financial experts, Mr. Balwant Sehgal and Mr. Ravi TN, who were warmly welcomed by the Vice Principal, Ms. Somdatta Bhattacharyya, and the Primary In charge, Ms. Himanshu Manchanda. The workshop aimed to increase financial awareness among teachers and provide them with practical tools for effective money management. The speakers shared valuable insights on savings, investments, and various types of insurance, including health insurance, term plans, and pension schemes. They also emphasized safe digital banking practices, highlighting essential cybersecurity measures. The session was both interactive and informative, with enthusiastic participation from the teachers. The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks.

4. On 29th May 2025, Vidyalaya organized a professional development session on the topic “Johari Window”, attended by 55 teachers of Vidyalaya. The session aimed to enhance self-awareness, interpersonal communication, and team-building skills among educators. The training began with engaging warm-up exercises, designed to break the ice and foster a comfortable learning environment. These activities set the tone for open dialogue and active participation throughout the session. The concept of the Johari Window—a psychological tool used to understand and improve self-perception and interpersonal relationships—was introduced in an interactive manner. Teachers explored its four quadrants: Open, Blind,

Hidden, and Unknown, through group discussions and reflective activities. The session emphasized the value of open communication, constructive feedback, and self-reflection. Overall, the training

was insightful and thought-provoking. It empowered teachers to better understand themselves and their colleagues, promoting a more collaborative, empathetic, and supportive work culture within the school.

5. JMV organized a training session on “Cyber Safety and Security” on May 29, 2025, which was attended by 55 teachers of Vidyalaya. It aimed at enhancing digital awareness and promoting safe online practices among educators. The training covered key topics such as identifying cyber threats, protecting personal and institutional data, responsible digital behavior, and the importance of cybersecurity in day to day life. Real-life case studies and interactive discussions made the session engaging and informative. The workshop not only deepened the participants' understanding of online safety but also equipped them with practical strategies to safeguard both personal and student data in an increasingly digital learning environment. Overall, it was a highly enriching and timely initiative that fostered a more secure and responsible digital culture within the school.

6. Assessment is the bridge between teaching and learning."With this guiding principle, 49 faculty members of Vidyalaya participated in a two-days offline Capacity Building Programme on Competency-Based Assessment, held on 26 May 2025 and 27 May 2025. The workshop was facilitated by two esteemed resource persons- Dr. Saurabh Malhotra, Principal, Gurusharan Convent, Paschim Vihar and Ms. Nishtha Khwatra, PGT Economics, St. Margaret Sr. Sec. School. The primary objective of the programme was to enhance educators' understanding of assessment—its purpose, importance, and the key elements that contribute to a meaningful and effective evaluation process.

### **DAY 1 (26 April 2025)**

As the workshop commenced, Dr. Saurabh Malhotra introduced “The Art and Science of Framing Good Questions.” Participants were divided into groups to discuss common classroom challenges and their solutions. This interactive session encouraged the sharing of experiences and promoted collaborative problem-solving, with valuable inputs and guidance from the resource persons.

The next segment focused on developing a deeper understanding of competency and its core components. Through a range of engaging and hands-on activities, educators explored how to craft effective questions that align with desired learning outcomes in a competency-based approach. Ms. Nishtha Khwatra shed light on the role of assessment within the framework of the National Education Policy (NEP), emphasizing Bloom's Taxonomy and recent CBSE guidelines. She also led discussions on best practices for framing Multiple Choice Questions or Select-Response type Questions. The programme was a rich and impactful learning experience, equipping the educators with practical strategies to implement competency-based assessments in their classrooms effectively.

**DAY 2 (27 April 2025)**

The second day of the workshop began with a recapitulation of the learnings of the previous day. Ms. Nishtha highlighted the importance of clearly stating and defining rubrics for students to attempt an answer. She referred to the guidelines provided in CBSE Circular No. 30 and elaborated on the key components of an ideal question paper while ensuring that it meets all necessary requirements. Participants were also guided on the appropriate mark allocation for both Select Response Questions and Constructed Response Questions, in alignment with Bloom's Taxonomy. Subsequently, Mr. Saurabh Malhotra led an insightful discussion on blueprint and its role in developing a balanced question paper. He provided a detailed outline of the steps involved in creating a high-quality, well-structured question paper. Later, during an engaging hands-on activity, all participants collaborated in groups to design a question paper aligned with the defined competencies and rubrics. As each group presented their question paper, the resource persons provided guidance by highlighting the shortcomings and offering suggestions for improvement. They also shared guidelines for preparation of a perfect marking scheme – an element as vital as the question paper itself. The feedback session reinforced and consolidated the learning of two days. Overall, the two day workshop provided a comprehensive and practical framework for designing competency based question papers as the participants gained valuable insights and tools to enhance assessment quality in alignment with CBSE standards.

7. A professional enrichment session was conducted for the teaching staff on 26 April 2025 and 27 April 2025. The goal of the session was to refresh teaching approaches, encourage creativity, and promote collaboration among educators. The session began with the canva workshop, where teachers explored the use of Canva for creating visually appealing teaching aids, worksheets, posters and presentations. The interactive nature of the workshop allowed teachers to experiment with design tools and apply their learning in real time. This was followed by the Art and Craft workshop, where teachers participated in hands-on creative activities such as paper folding, painting, and collaborative artwork. The workshop provided a relaxed and enjoyable atmosphere, encouraging creativity and teamwork. The first day featured insightful presentations on books by Ms. Umang and Ms. Seema Yadav. On the following day, Mr. Nirbhay Parashari, Ms. Kanchan Sharma, and Ms. Pallavi Sharma presented their book reviews during which teachers also shared their thoughts on a selection of books. They shared a brief summary of the selected book, discussed key insights, and reflected on how the book's themes or messages could influence the teaching practice. Teachers articulated their favourite quotes or key messages from the book. It offered a blend of technology, creativity, and reflective practice contributing to a well-rounded professional experience.

8. A workshop on CUET was conducted for teachers teaching classes XI and XII on 24 May 2025. Mr. Rajesh Mishra, the resource person, acquainted the teachers with the facts and

myths related to CUET, the different test domains and the available subject combinations. 25 teachers attended the session.

9. On May 24, 2025, Mr. Rakesh Atri (PGT Mathematics) attended the TIL-AI OER Co-Design Workshop organised by Common-Wealth Educational Media Centre Asia (CEMCA) in New Delhi. The workshop focused on developing high-quality open Educational Resources (OER) using an AI-powered adaptation tool.

10. ATL Training Program was conducted under ATL Sarthi Training Program on basics of Arduino for teachers at Rukmini Devi Institute of Advanced Studies (RDIAS) Rohini on 19 May 2025. It was led by Ms. Rubi Prasad, an expert in embedded systems. The session aimed to introduce the fundamental concept of Arduino, its components & application in various projects. The training session aimed to ignite curiosity & encourage hands-on experimentation. The session was attended by Ms Renu (TGT Computer Science).

11. To build the capacity of school leaders and educators in implementing vocational, art and physical education effectively, CBSE organised an Orientation cum Capacity Building Workshop for Principals and Teachers on 14 May 2025. The event was held at the Auditorium, CBSE integrated office, Sector 23, Dwarka, New Delhi. The programme began with Art Education session led by Ms. Sharvari Banerji. This session highlighted the importance of art in everyday life. It was followed by Vocational session which focused on integrating skill-based learning through projects and real-world applications, as envisioned in NEP 2020. Then Mr. Amit Dubey led an engaging session on Physical Education, where he illustrated the connection between physical education and various academic subjects. The sessions were informative and interactive, equipping educators with the knowledge and tools needed to enhance the learning experience for students across diverse domains. It was attended by Ms. Suman Yadav (PGT Phy. Ed.)

12. A meeting was organised for the Spoke Schools in accordance with the guidelines of 'Hub & Spoke Model' by CBSE on 5 May 2025. JMV as Hub school conducted the meeting. Vidyalaya Principal Ms. Anupma Bhardwaj acquainted the online congregation about the importance of the model and role of all the participating schools. She further discussed the activities to be conducted in the calendar of May-July. All the schools (10) participated actively and raised their queries during the discussion. It was attended by Ms Sangeeta Nain (PGT Psychology).

13. Counsellor and Special Educator of the Vidyalaya conducted a session for the teachers of Vidyalaya on 3 May 2025 to share learnings from CBSE webinars conducted under Hub & spoke Model. The teachers were briefed about Socio-Emotional Learning (SEL), Career Counselling and Invisible disabilities in the classroom and their integration in classroom transactions. The session concluded with an Orientation on 'PRASHAST' app. in which teachers were briefed about their role in using the app in initial screening of various disabilities.

14. A district level Virtual Training Program was organised for unaided private recognised schools to acquaint them with 'PRASHAST' mobile app on 1 May 2025. The agenda of the meeting was to orient the school counsellors & special educators about screening &

The schools were further directed to implement screening & identification of students in their respective schools by using the app with immediate effect & complete the screening till 25 July 2025. The session was attended by Ms. Sangeeta Nain (PGT Psychology) & Mr Vijay Rajeshwari (Special Educator).

15. ATL Robotics Workshop was organised by (ATL SARTHI CLUSTER) in Rukmini Devi Institute of Technology (RDIAS) on 24 April 2025. The workshop was organised to familiarize ATL mentors & tech innovator with basic functions of AI Tools. The resource person, Mr. Abhishek explained basic functionality of Aurdiono & ultrasonic sensors. It was attended by Ms. Renu (TGT Computer Science).

16. Gandhi Smriti & Darshan Samiti, as a part of its initiative to take Gandhiji-his ideology and life to schools, organised an Interactive session with teachers on 22 April 2025. The aim was to discuss & plan the calendar of activities for the session 2025-26. Sh.
