#### **FESTIVITIES IN JMV**

#### **REINVENTING OURSELVES**

##### **TEACHERS**

1. An online orientation programme on ENTAB was organised on 2 March 2026 which was attended by the Vice Principal, Sr. Incharge, Primary Incharge, all the H.O.D's and the Academic Coordinators along with the Examination In-charge. Resource Persons Ms. Shubhanshi Mittal and Ms. Tanushree acquainted the gathering with the dashboard and features like lesson plans, ERP, LMS etc. They also shared that the lesson plans and worksheets could be customised as per the need of the students.
2. An Online Open House session on Atal Tinkering Lab was organised by the Atal Innovation Mission team on 27 February 2026. ## **STUDENTS**

### **STUDENTS**

2. With the primary objective to foster environmental awareness among students and to encourage active youth participation in conservation of rivers, Mt. ### **EXCURSIONS**

1. An educational excursion for students of classes I-V was organized by Vidyalaya on 13 March 2026. The purpose of the trip was to provide students with learning experiences beyond the classroom and to help them explore significant places in the city. Teachers, along with one parent representative from each class, accompanied the students to ensure proper supervision and safety throughout the excursion. Students of Class I visited India Gate and the nearby Children's Park. They were excited to see the famous monument and thoroughly enjoyed playing in the park. Class II students visited the National Bal Bhawan where they

explored the Jawahar Fish Aquarium, visited the mini zoo and had fun with the magic mirrors that created amusing reflections. The students of Class III went to the Air Force Museum, where they observed various aircraft models, uniforms and displays related to the Indian Air Force. Class IV students visited the National War Memorial, learning about the bravery and sacrifices of Indian soldiers who served the nation. Students of Class V explored the historic Red Fort, gaining insights into India's rich history, architecture and cultural heritage. Overall, the excursion was both enjoyable and informative. It provided students with valuable knowledge, engaging experiences and an opportunity to learn outside the classroom.

2. A group of 48 students of Class XII, accompanied by three teachers, went on an excursion to the Archaeological Park, Mehrauli, on 18 March 2026.
